God of new life, bringing fulness of life, known to us in and through Christ, we come to praise you.



**SCRIPTURE READING** Mark 1:4-11 (GNB New Testament, page 45)

This is the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. <sup>2</sup> It began as the prophet Isaiah had written:

- "God said, 'I will send my messenger ahead of you to open the way for you.'
- <sup>3</sup> Someone is shouting in the desert, 'Get the road ready for the Lord; make a straight path for him to travel!'"
- <sup>4</sup> So John appeared in the desert, baptizing and preaching. "Turn away from your sins and be baptized," he told the people, "and God will forgive your sins." <sup>5</sup> Many people from the province of Judea and the city of Jerusalem went out to hear John. They confessed their sins, and he baptized them in the Jordan River.
- <sup>6</sup> John wore clothes made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. <sup>7</sup> He announced to the people, "The man who will come after me is much greater than I am. I am not good enough even to bend down and untie his sandals. <sup>8</sup> I baptize you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."
- <sup>9</sup> Not long afterward Jesus came from Nazareth in the province of Galilee, and was baptized by John in the Jordan. <sup>10</sup> As soon as Jesus came up out of the water, he saw heaven opening and the Spirit coming down on him like a dove. <sup>11</sup> And a voice came from heaven, "You are my own dear Son. I am pleased with you."
